We Have to Move. We Need Your Help!

PLEASE READ!

Dear friends,

I have some very bad news. On Monday January 12 St. Benedict notified me that they are required to start charging for the use of each room that we use on Saturdays and during the summer. Even though we have been giving SBA a donation (small) for each session, the amount they are required to charge per room is over 4 times what we generally donate totally.

The only way we could afford the increase would be to substantially increase tuition and other fees. We really do not want to do that and do not believe many of you could afford the increase that would be necessary to meet their fees. So, we are asking or begging all of you to ask your school, church or any other building that would be large enough to hold us if they would be willing to allow us to use their

I was tutoring a small child that is struggling in school. The parents are worried and are asking the same questions I asked some 33 years ago when our son, and later our daughter, were diagnosed with Dyslexia. I remember so well the anxiety I had, the complete helplessness, the confusion of what was best for my child. I wanted someone to say "Everything is going to be okay." "Try this or come to this program and everything will be fine." I wish it was in my power to sprinkle "Pixie Dust" on each child and parent to instantly take away the fear and uncertainty that you are feeling. Unfortunately, there is no quick "magic" cure. What I can say, is that if you stick with the Dyslexia Foundation, you will see positive results and make friends for life with other parents who are fighting the same battles you are. Well, to get back to my story, as I was talking with this mother and trying to reassure her that things were going to be okay, our daughter came into the room. Hearing the conversation, she sat down and explained to this mom how her child is feeling and how desperate he felt because he could not read and everyone else was reading so easily. As I listened to our daughter talk about how she felt before, during and after the Foundation had become a part of her life, I realized that I had made the correct decision some 30 years ago. And, yes, she had missed some slumber parties and yes, she had had to give up playing some organized sports and yes, she had missed a lot of other social activities. But, she had gained so much more. She had gained self-confidence. She knew she had to work harder than most to learn, but she knew she was smart. Also, she can now read and read well! Both of our children freely admit they have dyslexia. They don't use (as some do) their learning difference as a crutch to get out of work; rather, they learned to focus and get the job done. They use their learning disability as a positive factor in their lives. Dyslexia lets you think, reason and understand problems or situations better and more quickly than "normal" people. You may have to work harder in school but once you understand a concept, you can really use the information in life by applying it in interesting and creative ways. There are so many successful people with dyslexia that it makes you realize that our children can do anything or be anything they want to be. They just need people around them that believe in them and give them the support they need to have the self-confidence to know they can succeed.


Reflections

The holidays of 2014 were a hard time because of health issues and some personal issues. As you get older the mind starts slipping a bit, your joints start hurting a bit, you are not in the main flow and you start feeling life is passing you by. God sometimes gives you a "slap" in the face. Sort of a wakeup call; He says "Stop feeling so sorry for yourself and look around and appreciate what you have and appreciate what you can still do!" For me, it was in Sam's Club when I received the wakeup call. I ran into a couple who have two sons who have both been in the foundation. The first one was in the Foundation many years ago and is now a dentist. The other was attending a public high school and is a super athlete but was having trouble keeping his grades up to remain eligible for sports. The first son said, "Go back to Saturday School because it helped me, it will help my brother!" The parents brought the second son back to the Foundation. While in summer school the parents received a letter saying that their son would not be allowed to return to his school in the fall because the school no longer would make accommodations for LD students. Needless to say, the parents and their son were very frustrated. One day at the Foundation, the parents were asking what they could do to help their son. We discussed some of the rights the student has and what they can do to make the school what is, not only legal, but what is best for the welfare of the student. After talking with the director and others on courses of action, and a great deal of research and prayer, they decided on two courses of action. One was to take him out of the current school and put him in SBA and the other was to hire an attorney. The parents are seeking justice, not only for their son, but for all LD students trapped and discriminated against in the school system. The parents said at SBA their son made A's and B's with one C on his last report card, is a member of the sports team, has great self-confidence and is once again enjoying going to school.

We mostly think of the Dyslexia Foundation as a school to teach our children to read and, it mainly is. We also see our mission as a support group for parents and as an information source for the community. We try to impart information to let parents know the rights of the children and how to deal with the day to day problems that arise. We try to let everyone know that being dyslexic is not a curse or bad thing but a blessing in disguise. We try to show the children they are smart and just learn things differently than others. So look for the silver lining in your clouds of gray, or clouds of dyslexia, and know that God is listening and will make things right if only we have faith. Perhaps He will not make things the way we want them to be, but He will make things okay. So until next time, keep the faith and keep on keeping on.

The 12 Days of Christmas History and Foundation Version

The 12 Days of Christmas

For years I have heard the 12 Days of Christmas song; and for many years I thought it was a strange and silly song. Then, just recently, I received an email explaining the song and suddenly the song made sense. I thought you might enjoy knowing the true meaning of the song too. Hope your Christmas was the merriest ever and your New Year will be best ever.

There is one Christmas Carol that has always baffled me. What in the world do leaping lords, French hens, swimming swans, and especially the partridge, who won't come out of the pear tree have to do with Christmas?

This week, I found out.

From 1558 until 1829, Roman Catholics in England were not permitted to practice their faith openly. Someone during that era wrote this carol as a catechism song for young Catholics. It has two levels of meaning: the surface meaning plus a hidden meaning known only to members of their church. Each element in the carol has a code word for a religious reality which the children could remember:

- The eight maids a-milking were the eight beatitudes.
- Nine ladies dancing were the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit--Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness, and Self Control.
- The ten lords a-leaping were the ten commandments.
- The eleven pipers piping stood for the eleven faithful disciples.
- The twelve drummers drumming symbolized the twelve points of belief in the Apostles' Creed.

So there is your history for today. This knowledge was shared with me and I found it interesting and enlightening and now I know how that strange song became a Christmas Carol...so pass it on if you wish.'

Dear Parents and Tutors:

We are again planning a 12 week fall program. It will be conducted on Saturdays from 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. The program will run from Saturday, January 24 to Saturday, April 25, 2015 at St. Benedict at Auburndale High School (SBA), 8250 Varnavas Dr., Cordova, TN 38016.

Workshops, which are mandatory for all personnel, will be held Saturday January 17, 2015, from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. at St. Benedict at Auburndale School **BRING A LUNCH!!!!**

The Dyslexia Foundation's own language curriculum is used for instruction. Students **MUST** take part in the full curriculum for the entire 12 week period.

The following policies must be understood by all who apply to the program - - as tutors or students:

1. Only those who have been recommended will be accepted as students. Please contact a Director if you have questions about being accepted.
2. All tutors must be sixteen years of age or older.
3. All participants must be current members of The Dyslexia Foundation of Memphis. Dues are \$20.00.
4. A certain dress code will be observed by everyone.
5. **ALL WORKSHOPS ARE MANDATORY FOR ALL PERSONNEL.**
6. All personnel must fulfill all obligations as set forth in the application contract.

Please apply for the subject you prefer to tutor, math or language. New parent-tutors apply only for reading.

The following areas require tutors:

1. Reading (All tutors tutor Language)
2. Math

Workshops and daily staff meetings will provide instruction in the use of the materials. Supervision will be given over all areas of instruction.

The tuition is \$200.00 per student plus a \$75.00 registration fee. The entire amount is due with the application before January 17, 2015. It cannot be refunded. Remember parents must tutor must fill out an application. The above figures require an enrollment of 60 students in order for the Foundation to offer the Fall Program at this tuition cost.

All applications must be returned before January 17, 2015. If you are unable to meet this deadline please call and notify the Director of your intentions. Neither students nor tutor applications will be accepted after that date unless verbal approval has been made. An exception will be made for new families who were tested during the fall 2014 semester.
