Then he produced about a dozen fist-sized rocks and carefully placed them, one at a time, into the jar. When the jar was filled to the top and no more rocks would fit inside, he asked, "Is this jar full?" Everyone in the class said, "Yes." Then he said, "Really?" He reached under the table and pulled out a bucket of gravel. Then he dumped some gravel in and shook the jar causing pieces of gravel to work themselves down into the spaces between the big rocks. Then he asked the group once more, "Is this jar full?"

By this time the class was onto him. "Probably not," one of them answered.

"Good!" he replied. He reached under the table and brought out a bucket of sand. He started dumping the sand in and it went into all the spaces left between the rocks and the gravel. Once more he asked the question, "Is this jar full?" "No!" the class shouted. Once again he said, "Good!"

Levine, a pediatric neurologist. In the class, I learned how the neuron developmental systems of the body determine how we learn. Neuro means nervous system or brain. Therefore, this is just a fancy name for how our brain develops. The class taught me there are eight areas of the brain involved in learning. They are attention, temporal sequential ordering (putting events in order by what happened 1st, 2nd, etc.), Spatial ordering (storing and recalling shapes, symbols, etc.), memory, language, motor function, social awareness, higher order cognition (critical thinking skills). The class taught (as we all are too aware) if anything goes wrong with any of these eight things the child/adult will have a hard time learning information in school. The class further taught some interesting strategies on how to help "our kids" learn information better. We will discuss these learning strategies in future newsletters or on our web page. This was a very interesting class and I learned a great deal; but the main thing I learned is entire groups of people feel strongly that children vary widely in their ability to learn. They have strengths and weaknesses, and this variation has powerful implications for educating all kinds of minds. No one can be good at everything. Many students possess highly specialized minds and deserve to be recognized for their abilities while not being declared "dumb" for their shortcomings. WOW! What a powerful idea and these people are teaching educators this concept by the hundreds. I am so excited that the word is being spread into our Mid-South educational community. There were twenty-two other educators in this class; and this is the fourth year they have taught the class in Memphis. Exciting! We are again planning a 4 week summer program. It will be conducted week days from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. The program will run Monday June 18, 2007 to Friday, July 13, 2007 at St. Benedict at Auburndale High School (SBA), 8250 Varnavas Dr., Cordova, TN 38016.

Workshops, which are mandatory for all personnel, will be held on June 14 & 15, 2007, from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. at St. Benedict at Auburndale School BRING A LUNCH!!!!

The Dyslexia Foundation's own language curriculum is used for instruction. Students MUST take part in the full curriculum for the entire 4 week period.

The following policies must be understood by all who apply to the program - - as tutors or students:

1. Only those who have been tested and recommended will be accepted as students. Please contact a Director if you have questions about being accepted. Exceptions can be made.
2. Unexcused absences by anyone (students and/or personnel) can result in dismissal from the program and all future Foundation programs. Illness is the only acceptable reason for absence. Any other excuse must be cleared before the absence by the board.
3. All tutors must exceed sixteen years of age.
4. All participants must be current members of The Dyslexia Foundation of Memphis. Dues are \$15.00.
5. A certain dress code will be observed by everyone.
6. ALL WORKSHOPS ARE MANDATORY FOR ALL PERSONNEL.
7. All personnel must fulfill all obligations as set forth in the application contract.

Please apply for the subject you prefer to tutor, math or social values. New parent-tutors apply only for reading. The following areas require tutors:

1. Reading
2. Math

Workshops and daily staff meetings will provide instruction in the use of the materials. Supervision will be given over all areas of instruction.

The tuition will be \$550.00 per student. The entire amount is due with the application before June 12, 2007. It cannot be refunded. Remember parents who are going to tutor must apply. The above figures require an enrollment of 60 students in order for the Foundation to offer the Summer Program at this tuition cost.

All applications must be returned before June 14, 2007. If you are unable to meet this deadline please call and notify the Director of your intentions. Neither students nor tutor applications will be accepted after that date unless verbal approval has been made. An exception will be made for new families who were tested during the Spring 2007 semester.
